

DROP INTO GOD'S LAP

Monday nights at Station X is an alternative youth/young adult church. Most of the youth who are a part of the Station X family are from the streets or deal with varying disabilities. We recently had a night where we focused on giving our worries over to God by discussing scripture and sharing stories. To apply these principles in a tangible way, we constructed a water fountain out of scraps of junk, old computer and bicycle parts and a small pump. As the fountain was running, we then took small, polished rocks and listened to a meditative reading that described letting go of our worries and dropping them into God's lap. We were instructed to identify a worry, represented by one of the polished stones. Then, as the youth were praying and listening to God's voice, they would toss the stone into the fountain... and letting go. After this reflective time was over, we all shared what our worries were, what God was speaking to us about, and what scripture says about it all. It was a very meaningful night.

In the last few months, he just seems so much softer and he listens and participates during our discussion times.
